Subject: Non Compliance UK Docks, River Drive.

Dear Cllr Anglin,

When I wrote to you on the 7th April I should have copied my email to the other Ward Councillors because:

- Cllr Macmillan was also at the meeting where we were all misinformed about the width and height of the cover or shed;
- I have been advised that Cllr Woods was in discussion with Head of Development Services, Mr Mansbridge, (HDS) and the Council's Solicitor about the cover when Council had reverted to view that the cover was not too high i.e. HDS was using unapproved drawings.

It appears that Corporate Lead, Hayley Johnson is using Customer Advocacy to try and enforce silence on the question of the planned height of the cover on UK Docks slipway on River Drive.

It was common knowledge as soon as the frames went up in September 2013 that the cover was too high and by the time of the meeting in November many of us thought it was too wide as well. Now it is quite possible that the Council were not aware that it was too wide when Peter Cunningham told us that the structure was 'legal' but the height is a different matter.

We were told in the response to our Petition by HDS the Council took measurements on 17th September but there is no record of the site being visited that day – EIR 17773. I suggest all of you read my analysis of the situation regarding all the plans and drawings that have been made available to the local residents over the last 3 years. Did you not think it strange that Mr Cunningham did not give us a copy of the so called legal plans at the meeting? No-one, and I repeat no-one, in the Council has been able to back up their view that the cover is the correct height in all that time since then.

It looks events have overtaken us with the announcement that there is going to be a General Election on June 8th and for now we must concentrate our efforts in getting our MP re-elected but you can rest assured that I will return to this on June 9th.

By that time, I hope you will have found time to read my analysis and agree with me, and the Local Residents, that it is the Council that are wrong about height of the cover.
