When I last wrote to you about this matter I had a temporary address in Amble at 5 Second Avenue. The email was was mainly for reference. I have mentioned you in the last page of it. The email is about how South Tyneside Council have corrupted their complaints procedure which requires them to give misinformation/misrepresentation to the Local Government Ombudsman.

You wrote on my behalf to the Chief Executive of South Tyneside Council on 1st June 2015 about the height of a shipyard shed and the response of 25 June, signed by Mrs Hayley Johnson, said; "The matters and allegations raised by your constituent are well documented and have been subject to a number of enquiries from Mr Dawson and other local residents over a lengthy period of time.
